OCREA... Working for Retired Educators

The Oklahoma County Retired Educators Association was organized for all members of the Teachers' Retirement System (TRS) who live in Oklahoma County. Anyone who receives a retirement check from TRS (teacher, administrator, support personnel, health care services, spouse of member) is entitled and encouraged to become a member.

Meetings are held the second or third Saturday of September, November, February and April. Five newsletters are mailed/emailed each year.

Interesting programs and activities are planned for our members. Officers and committee chairmen act as liaison to the community and legislature. The membership, officers, and especially the Legislative Committee, spend long hours working with the legislature to bring about much needed benefits. OCREA Members reap the rewards of their hard work through the paid insurance program and pension raises.

All of the Officers and committees are at work for the benefit of the membership. The OCREA dues remain low. This gives everyone an opportunity to share the load. If you can't serve on a committee, hold an office, lobby at the legislature, or even attend a meeting, you can still help by paying your dues, which are only \$15 per year, so others may carry on the work. The more members we have, the more power we have. **Join now and encourage others to join.**

PLEASE NOTE: OREA is the state organization. Some of you may pay your dues to OREA through payroll deduction from your TRS retirement check. **OCREA** is a local unit for Oklahoma County.
